DELAWARE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE #2016-16

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF DELAWARE, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO AUTHORIZE AN APPROPRIATION AND EXPENDITURE FROM RESERVE FOR THE PURCHASE OF DATA PROCESSING EQUIPMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,000.00; AND TO AUTHORIZE AN APPROPRIATION AND EXPENDITURE FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,500.00, FOR THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF COMPUTER SOFTWARE FOR THE DELAWARE TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL BUILDING.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Delaware, County of Hunterdon, and State of New Jersey as follows:

- Section 1. Delaware Township has a need to purchase and install computer software for the Delaware Township Municipal Building; and,
- Section 2. Delaware Township hereby authorizes an appropriation and expenditure from Reserve for the Purchase of Data Processing Equipment in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00, for the purchase and installation of a computer software system for the Delaware Township Municipal Building; and,
- Section 3. Delaware Township hereby authorizes an appropriation and expenditure from the Capital Improvement Fund in an amount not to exceed \$3,500.00, for the purchase and installation of a computer software system for the Delaware Township Municipal Building; and,
- Section 4. Total amount to be expended for the purchase and installation of a computer software system for the Delaware Township Municipal Building shall not exceed \$8,500.00; and,
- Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey.
