Minutes: November 20, 2019

The minutes of the noted meeting were distributed prior to the meeting. Member Katz made a motion to approve the minutes for discussion. Member Kafarski seconded the motion. The minutes were discussed, and changes were made including typographical errors. Said motion was approved by voice vote, with abstentions by Member Royal.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Penn East Pipeline – S. Lockwood

Member Lockwood noted that there are no updates on the progress of Penn East and its request to put aside the eminent domain decision.

Site Inspection Committee – K. Klink

There was no application submitted to the Planning Board.

Clean Communities – K. Klink

Member Klink reported that was a mini-clean-up by a Girl Scout troop along the Wickecheoke, near the intersection of Lower Creek Road and Sanford Road. She noted that the first part of the clean-up was on December 5 and that the girls found a very large gate and returned on December 12 to get it off of the creek shoreline.

Planning Board – K. Katz

Member Katz reported that there are no applications before the Planning Board.

Open Space Committee – S. Lockwood

Member Lockwood reported that the Lee Lau project has been tabled, until the return of the applicants, from overseas. Member Lockwood noted that the Herman farm on Route 523 is under consideration. She noted that the Cizak property has a gap in funding issues. She noted that the Maresca-Martin project is moving forward. She further noted that the Curtis Farm is under consideration by NJCF, New Jersey Conservation Foundation.

It was noted that Kathy Katz agreed to become the Environmental Commission representative to the Open Space Committee.

Stormwater Management – S. Lockwood

Member Lockwood noted that there is nothing new to report. She did note that the stormwater management project on Zentek Road, as a part of the paving project, has been completed.

Easement Monitoring – R. Mongelli/J. Kafarski

Members Katz, Kafarski, and Royal agreed to meet to set up a plan for researching the properties in need of monitoring for this project. It was noted that this information will be useful in seeking funding for plantings within easement areas.

Schools – K. Klink

The Environmental Congress student group has been meeting to work on tree selection for the 2nd grade Arbor Day program.

Grants – K. Klink

Member Klink reported that the Township Committee has agreed to the development of a Green Team in an effort to apply for grants from Sustainable Jersey.

Website – J. Kafarski

The contract for the website development has been finalized.
