Zack Burger introduced himself to the rest of the Commission. He noted that he has been involved with Community Gardens and suggested that the Township might be interested in establishing one. It was noted that the property around the Police Station might be a good location. Member Burger noted that using raised beds is a good option for identifying participants. There was also a discussion about test holes to analyze the soil.

## Minutes: May 19, 2021

The minutes of the noted meeting were distributed prior to the meeting. Member Polay made a motion to approve the minutes for discussion. Member Lockwood seconded the motion. The minutes, as presented, were approved by voice vote with no abstentions.

### Open Space Committee – K. Katz

Member Katz reported that the Lee Lau project has been cancelled due to a misunderstanding about land values of certain portions of the property. Member Katz noted that the Curtis Farm project will be closing soon and that no Township money was involved.

### Planning Board – K. Katz

Member Katz reported that the Planning Board had a discussion on the Cannabis Ordinance that was introduced by Township Committee. There was discussion about the classes of this program, i.e. growers, sellers, licenses, etc. She noted that the Township Committee recommended to opt out of five classes of the program at this time. She noted that the class for delivery would be left in.

There was a discussion about farmers using this as a cash crop. It was suggested that the Ag Advisory Committee might take a look at this and make a recommendation.

Member Katz also noted that this issue on cannabis might need to be included with the Reexamination of the Master Plan. It was further noted that by opting out, an ordinance can be submitted that will clarify the Town's stance on the topic and the Township can opt back in. Member Katz noted that this opting-out allows the Township to have some time to figure out what would benefit the Township.

The Planning Board agreed that the Township should opt out at this time, per the introduced ordinance, until there is more specific guidance from the State.

Member Katz reported that the Planning Board will have a work session on the Reexamination of the Master Plan in place of the regular July meeting.

Two elements of the Reexamination were discussed which the Environmental Commission can help develop. One element is the Conservation Element. Member Katz noted that the Reexamination can report on what is going on in the Township, including a summary about preservation. Member Lockwood noted that the 2012 plan should be checked for accuracy of information. She further noted if this element as written is too vague, more detail should be provided. The second element to be considered is green infrastructure.
