Minutes: July 21, 2021

Clean Communities - K. Klink

Member Klink reported that due to the level of the river and the possible contaminants in the river, a decision was made to postpone the clean up to October 16. All other details remain the same.

Planning Board – K. Katz

Member Katz reported that the Master Plan Subcommittee has been working on the Reexamination of the Master Plan. She noted that the Subcommittee reported that they are about two-thirds of the way done. She further stated that the Subcommittee is hoping to be ready for comments at the October meeting.

Easement Monitoring – M. Royal No meeting

<u>Schools</u> – K. Klink

March on Litter is being supported by Delaware Township School, with one teacher per grade level, grades 4 through 8 helping out with the registration.

Grants – M. Royal, D. Polay

Member Royal reported that a recent NEEF grant was available but that the decision was made to not apply due to the requirements of the grant.

Member Royal also noted that the grant subcommittee is going to research paving the path around Dilts that has the highest use. Vice Chair Katz stated that the Rec Commission should be consulted as they are considering future development of Dilts Park. She further noted that this information should be included in the Reexamination of the Master Plan.

Website – J. Kafarski

Member Kafarski reported that the new website looks great. Secretary Klink reported that it is very easy to put information on the website. She noted that items can be posted in more than one place; for example, on the Township Calendar and on the EC portion of the website. She also noted that the EC has a calendar "ribbon" on the right side of the EC page.

• Community Gardens by J. Kafarski and Z. Burger

Member Kafarski stated that he reviewed the Sustainable Jersey ideas about how to start a community garden. It was noted that if the EC wishes to be established with Sustainable Jersey, a minimum of points for various projects has to be obtained. It was noted that 10 to 15 points can be accrued through the establishment of a community garden.

It was noted that in organizing a community garden, the first step is to survey the community for input. Possible sites were discussed, as follows: Dilts Park, DT School (availability of student labor), field adjacent to the Police Station. It was noted that one aspect to consider is the infrastructure to support the garden, i.e. water, electricity, etc.

Further discussion will include who establishes the garden, the development of the site, and the preparation of the garden. It was noted that further details from Sustainable Jersey may be needed in order to proceed.

The Environmental Commission decided to review survey questions at the October meeting.

• TS Ida Debris

Member Royal noted that there is a lot of debris in all of the streams. She discussed the possibility of developing a mechanism to retrieve this debris. It was noted that Clean Communities money can be used, especially for the disposal. The EC tabled this for further discussion.
