Open Space Committee – K. Katz

Member Katz reported that there was a meeting on this past Monday. She noted that the Lee Lau project needs a revision to the title; and the project is being reviewed at SADC. She noted that the Curtis Farm project will close soon. She noted no change to the Yerk property project.

Member Katz noted that there was some discussion about Ken Johnson's property, at the corner of Ferry Road and Route 523. It was noted that Mr. Johnson had recently passed away. She noted that the Open Space Committee would like to reach out to the family to inquire about preservation.

Member Katz noted that the Farmland Preservation Element may need some minor language changes and updated maps. It was noted that the Open Space and Recreation Improvement and Maintenance plan has been sent to the Township Committee for approval, to then be moved on to the County.

Member Katz reported that the Township Committee has advertised for the OS Coordinator position. She noted that one application is in, with another to follow. She also noted that the TC may reach out to surrounding Townships for interest in this position.

<u>Planning Board</u> – K. Katz

Member Katz reported that the main topic of discussion was the start of the reexamination plan for the Master Plan. She noted that the PB will have to identify items to achieve, and to review past goals for success/failure. She reported that Planner Dickerson gave a presentation providing background on the project. It was suggested that the PB reach out to various boards, commissions and committees and ask for input from those groups on various elements.

Member Katz noted that the Planning Board has to adopt a Reexamination Report by September 4, 2022. She noted that new elements have been added concerning green issues, including conservation and climate change related to vulnerability assessment.

Secretary Klink reported that the conservation element will be distributed to members. The topic of green projects could be added to this element. Secretary Klink also reported that much information can be accessed from ANJEC and the Watershed Institute.

Member Lockwood reported that there is a Hillsborough presentation that could be an outline to follow.

Member Katz stated that in 1994, the recycling and solid waste elements were added.

Member Kafarski reported that Kevin Eberle, of Trinity Web Media has fixed the calendar and the bluebird flyer was displayed. He noted that the latest bios are still not up.

Member Kafarski asked for email links that would direct residents to outside resources, and he will connect with Kevin. It was decided that John will be the contact between the Commission and Kevin.

The Commission discussed Quarterly Topic #2. It was agreed that the emerald ash borer (EAB) is still a very pertinent topic. It was decided to leave Quarterly Topic #2 as Threats from Pests, with a rehash of last year's information and updates as provided.

North Jersey RC&D (Resource, Conservation & Development) asked that a flyer about a rain garden program be displayed on our site. Members agreed; Secretary Klink also stated that she will ask the school to do an eblast.

There was discussion about items that need to come and go on the website, or to be revised. Member Kafarski stated that he will find out more about this.

There was also a discussion about email sign ups. Member Kafarski stated that nothing has come through on this yet. It was noted that the Township Committee is reviewing the Township website, at this time. Member Lockwood stated that complaints continue to come in about the difficulty of using the Township website. There was an IT meeting with Kevin Eberle of Trinity, Deputy Clerk Crivelli, and Township Committee Member Herman about one month ago, with no report given.

The EC decided to look at the original contract to see if everything has been done per that contract. Member Kafarski stated that he felt that most of the issues are out of last year's contract. He stated that he will look at the contract more critically.

Member Lockwood stated that she was on the Kingwood Township website that was much easier to use. She noted that Kingwood has a person who manages it. She stated that she felt that it was the mayor.

Penn East Pipeline – S. Lockwood

Member Lockwood reported that this Committee meeting is Thursday night. She noted that the Federal government sent contact information about how the state can stop the pipeline. She noted that there is some confusion about what the federal government is doing. She noted that the arguments will be presented before the US Supreme Court and should be soon.
